Wherever Jess Lockwood goes, he carries a little reminder of his friend and fellow cowboy Mason Lowe a cross made from the leather of Lowe's boots the day the professional bull rider died inside the pen at the

Denver Coliseum.

The cross stays in Lockwood's rodeo gear bag, evidence of the risk he takes every time he mounts a bucking bull.

"To have a friend pass away doing what I do every weekend, it changes your mind-set for damn sure," said Lockwood, the third-ranked bull rider in the world. "It kind of makes you just appreciate everything you got in life."

As the National Western Stock Show celebrates its 114th year in Denver, the

rodeo community is still recovering from Lowe's death on Jan. 15, 2019 — the first rodeo-related death in the

China **VOWS** to alter actions

U.S. companies will not have to give up intellectual property

washington» The trade deal that President Donald Trump will sign Wednesday includes commitments by China to curtail practices that American companies complain put them at a disadvantage and force them to hand over valuable intellectual property to Chinese firms, according to several people with knowledge of the deal.

Those concessions - along with China's agreement to buy \$200 billion worth of American goods and to allow greater access to its markets — are expected to be announced at a White House ceremony for the signing of the long-awaited trade deal.
